TITLE: Emergency Ambulance Employee Safety Act

SUMMARY:

Requires every current emergency ambulance employee and every new employee hired on or after January 2020, within 6 months of being hired, to attend a 6-hour training on violence prevention that includes, among other things, understanding the types of anger, proven and effective verbal deescalation skills, and hands-on demonstrations, workshops, and role-playing scenarios.

Requires the State Department of Public Health to consider a report from a laboratory of an employee's blood lead level at or above 20 micrograms per deciliter to be injurious to the health of the employee and to report that case within 5 business days of receiving the report to the Division of Occupational safety and Health. Provides that the report would constitute a serious violation and subject the employer or place of employment to an investigation by the division.

SUMMARY:

Makes a property owner, or agent thereof, who participates in a program to abate lead based paint created as a result of a judgment or settlement in any public nuisance or similar litigation, and all public entities, immune from liability in any lawsuit, seeking to recover any cost associated with that abatement program.

Prohibits participation in a lead paint abatement program from being considered as evidence that a property constitutes a nuisance, or is substandard or untenantable.

Prohibits the outdoor use at a schoolsite of a pesticide that contains glyphosate. Requires pest management practices employed in place of the use of glyphosate at a schoolsite are consistent with the state policy to use effective least toxic pest management practices at schoolsites. Adds to the duties of schools. Imposes a state mandated local program. Provides that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines mandated costs are included, reimbursement shall be made pursuant to statutory provisions.

Requests the California Council on Science and Technology to undertake and to complete a study analyzing the potential impacts of increased hydrogen concentration in the natural gas supply on the California natural gas system, including specified information. Requires the PUC, if the Council agrees to undertake and complete the study, to adopt standards for hydrogen to be injected into a common carrier pipeline, taking the study into consideration, while insuring pipeline facility safety.

SUMMARY:

Prescribes that a cosmetic is adulterated if it contains asbestos, lead, or any of several specified intentionally added ingredients. Requires a referral to be made if the division determines that the cosmetic is adulterated and require those referrals to additionally be made to the Department of Justice. Specifies that it is a violation of the Sherman Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Law to fail to comply with guidelines or instructions issued by the division to implement these provisions.

Authorizes the board to establish criteria for licensing home inspectors and establish fees for licensing and renewal. Authorizes the registrar to enforce the licensing provisions. Exempts a licensed general contractor, pest control operator, architect, or professional engineer from these licensing provisions.

Removes the minimum time requirement for qualifying hospitalizations, excluding those for medical observation or diagnostic testing. Explicitly includes the loss of an eye as a qualifying injury. Deletes loss of a body member from the definition of serious injury and instead includes amputation.

Revises the definition of industrial hemp. Expands the registration requirements to apply to growers of industrial hemp for noncommercial as well as commercial purposes. Imposes new requirements for the handling and transmittal of registration information.
