23 year old Tree Service Worker Killed on First Day of Job


- November 14, 2016
- Pulled into a wood chipper his first day on the job.

OSHA investigation found:

- Failure to provide safety training
- Failure to protect workers from the wood chipper's rotating parts.
- Failure to ensure workers used safe operating procedures
- Exposed employees to laceration, amputation, and eye hazards while operating chain saws
- Employees did not wear protective helmet or leg protection while trimming branches
- Employees not trained on use of PPE.
- The proposed fines for these violations total \$141,811.

- AIHA/NIOSH "Safety Matters" Initiative based on NIOSH's "Youth @ Work: Talking Safety" curriculum (www.cdc.gov/NIOSH/Talking Safety)
- Developed for schools throughout the US.
- "Safety Matters" 1-hr interactive teaching module targeting grades 7 to 12.
- California long version "Talking Safety" curriculum.

Chop's Teen Club - Future Plans

- Job Fair scheduled for March 2017
- Booth to inform employers of their responsibilities within the permit system.
- "Teen Workers Real Jobs/Real Risks" video and "Are You a Teen Worker" handout.
- Discussions with H.S. College Career Coordinators, Continuing Education and Career Technical (vocational) schools.
- LOHP train the trainer sessions
- Discussions with Santa Rosa Superintendent to integrate curricula into school work permit application process.

What Can We Do?

- Collaboration with College and Career Coordinators
- Engage Students and Early Career Professionals committee at AIHA
- Engage University IH Graduate Students to teach curricula
- Support LOHP's "Safe Jobs for Youth Month" (in May) and
- Support Young Worker Leadership Academy and other peer leader programs
- Discuss institutionalizing OSH training at the H.S. level
- Discuss improvements to CA's work permit system

- State work permit process
