**AMY ZIMPFER** is Associate Air Division Director for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (USEPA's) Region 9 office in San Francisco, California. In Spring, 2008, she served as an Embassy Science Fellow at the U.S. Embassy in Lisbon, Portugal focusing on climate change and renewable energy. Ms. Zimpfer has also served as a Senior Policy Advisor to the Regional Administrator and in a wide variety of managerial and engineering positions in Water, Waste, and Superfund Divisions at USEPA. From 1989 to 1994, she was Director of the San Francisco Estuary Project, a locally based effort involving over 120 stakeholders to develop consensus on a Comprehensive Plan to restore the San Francisco Bay and Delta. She served five years as a Commissioner on the San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission. Ms. Zimpfer also worked as a Hazardous Waste Engineer for the State of California Department of Health Services, Toxic Substances Control Division. Prior to coming to California, Ms. Zimpfer researched abandoned mines for the State of Colorado and worked as an engineer for the Town of Breckenridge and the City of Littleton, Colorado. Ms. Zimpfer is a registered Professional Civil Engineer in the State of California and received her Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Colorado at Boulder. She is married and has two daughters.
