TITLE: Emergency Ambulance Employee Safety Act

LOCATION: ASSEMBLY

SUMMARY:

Requires every current emergency ambulance employee and every new employee hired on or after January 2020, within 6 months of being hired, to attend a 6-hour training on violence prevention that includes, among other things, understanding the types of anger, proven and effective verbal deescalation skills, and hands-on demonstrations, workshops, and role-playing scenarios.

LOCATION: Chaptered

SUMMARY:

Requires the State Department of Public Health to consider a report from a laboratory of an employee's blood lead level at or above 20 micrograms per deciliter to be injurious to the health of the employee and to report that case within 5 business days of receiving the report to the Division of Occupational safety and Health. Provides that the report would constitute a serious violation and subject the employer or place of employment to an investigation by the division.

TITLE: Occupational Safety and Health: Valley Fever

LOCATION: Chaptered

SUMMARY:

Requires construction employers engaging in specified work activities or vehicle operation in counties where Valley Fever is highly endemic to provide effective awareness training on Valley Fever to all employees annually and before an employee begins work that is reasonably anticipated to cause substantial dust disturbance. Provides that the training is not required during the first year that the county is listed as highly endemic, but would be required in subsequent years.

TITLE: Public Nuisance: Abatement: Lead Based Paint

LOCATION: Chaptered

SUMMARY:

Makes a property owner, or agent thereof, who participates in a program to abate lead based paint created as a result of a judgment or settlement in any public nuisance or similar litigation, and all public entities, immune from liability in any lawsuit seeking to recover any cost associated with that abatement program. Prohibits participation in a lead paint abatement program from being considered as evidence that a property constitutes a nuisance, or is substandard or untenantable.

SUMMARY:

Establishes a Local Emergency Preparedness and Hazard Mitigation Fund to support staffing, planning, and other emergency mitigation priorities to help local governments meet emergency management, preparedness, readiness, and resilience goals. Requires the Office of Emergency Services to establish the Local Emergency Preparedness and Hazard Mitigation Fund Committee to adopt guidelines identifying eligible uses of the funds.

SUMMARY:

Prescribes that a cosmetic is adulterated under provisions of the Sherman Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Law if it contains asbestos, lead, any of several specified intentionally added ingredients, or another chemical or contaminant identified by the Department of Public Health. Specifies that it is a violation of the Law to fail to comply with guidelines or instructions issued by the Division to implement the Act.

SUMMARY:

Requires the manufacturer of a hazardous substance or mixture of substances that

constitutes a cosmetic or is used as a disinfectant, as defined, that is required to create an MSDS, for that product to post and maintain the MSDS on its internet website, as prescribed, by its brand name or other commonly known name in a manner generally accessible to the public.

TITLE: COVID 19: Imminent Hazard to Employees: Exposure

LOCATION: Chaptered

SUMMARY:

Authorizes the Division of Occupational Safety and Health, when, in its opinion, a place of employment, operation, or process, or any part thereof, exposes workers to the risk of infection with severe acute respiratory syndrome, also known as coronavirus, so as to constitute an imminent hazard to employees, to prohibit the performance of that operation or process, or entry into that place of employment.

TITLE: Public Water Systems: Perfluoroalkyl Substances

LOCATION: Chaptered

SUMMARY:

Authorizes the State Water Resources Control Board to order a public water system to monitor for perfluoroalkyl substances and polyfluoroalkyl substances. Requires a community water system or a nontransient noncommunity water system, upon a detection of these substances, to report that detection.

SUMMARY:

Enacts the Home Inspector License Act to revise and recast the regulation of persons who perform certain home inspections for a fee in connection with a transfer of real property. Requires the Department of Consumer Affairs to administer and enforce the provisions of the Act. Sets forth application requirements. Establishes the Home Inspectors License Fund.

TITLE: Employment Safety: Firefighting Equipment: Mechanics

LOCATION: Chaptered

SUMMARY:

Requires the Commission on Health and Safety and Workers' Compensation, in partnership with the County of Los Angeles and relevant labor organizations, to submit a study on the risk of exposure to carcinogenic materials and incidence of occupational cancer in mechanics who repair and clean firefighting vehicles in the County of Los Angeles.

TITLE: Hazardous Materials: Business Plans

SUMMARY:

Requires a business with a facility that is not required to submit Tier II information pursuant to certain federal provisions, and is not subject to the provisions governing those aboveground storage tanks, to submit its business plan once every three years, instead of annually.

LOCATION: ASSEMBLY

SUMMARY:

Transfers a certain amount as a loan to the Toxic Substances Control Account and appropriates these funds to the Department of Toxic Substances Control for activities related to accelerating the investigation and cleanup of homes and communities in a specified area that have lead contamination levels that exceed 80 parts per million.

TITLE: Hazardous Substances: Contaminated Property: Fentanyl

SUMMARY:

Renames the Methamphetamine Contaminated Property Cleanup Act as the Methamphetamine or Fentanyl Contaminated Property Cleanup Act. Applies all provisions of the act to fentanyl contaminated property, including property owner site assessment, remediation, cleanup, and financial liability, civil penalties, and local health officer responsibilities. Provides a specified standard for maximum methamphetamine levels and provides additional standards for maximum levels of lead and mercury, if applicable.

SUMMARY:

Requires the report of serious occupational injury, illness, or death to the division to be made immediately by telephone or through an online mechanism established by the division for that purpose.

TITLE: Occupational Safety and Health

SUMMARY:

Recasts the definition of serious injury or illness for purposes of reporting serious occupational injury or illness to the Division of Occupational Safety and Health. Removes the minimum time requirement for qualifying hospitalizations, excluding those for medical observation or diagnostic testing. Includes the loss of an eye as a qualifying injury. Deletes loss of a body member from the definition of serious injury and instead includes amputation.

TITLE: Agricultural Employers and Employees: COVID 19 Response

SUMMARY:

Requires the Division of Occupational Safety and Health to disseminate, in both English and Spanish, information on best practices for COVID 19 infection protection consistent with Guidance Documents available on the Division's website, including CAL OSHA Safety and Health Guidance: COVID 19 Infection Protection for Agricultural Employers and Employees.

Requires the statewide outreach campaign to include public service announcements on local Spanish radio stations.

TITLE: School Facilities: Indoor Air Quality LOCATION: Assembly Education Committee

SUMMARY:

Requires a school district to ensure that school facilities meet the minimum requirements of regulations enacted by the Occupational Safety and Health Standards Board that govern the quality of air provided to employees in places of employment. Requires school districts to use contractors who have been certified by a nationally recognized organization for the inspection and maintenance of heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems.

TITLE: Adult Performers: Employment Rights

LOCATION: Assembly Labor and Employment Committee

SUMMARY:

Prohibits adult entertainers or performers from working at an adult entertainment business or working in an adult entertainment video unless they have a received a certificate of training completion regarding their employment rights. Requires these entertainers and performers to complete a specified biennial training program regarding safety and working rights for adult entertainment workers. Requires the Department of Industrial Relations to create the training program and to convene an advisory group.

TITLE: Personal Protective Equipment: Health Care Employees

LOCATION: Chaptered

SUMMARY:

Requires public and private employers of workers in a general acute care hospital to supply those employees who provide direct patient care, or provide services that directly support personal care, with the personal protective equipment necessary to

comply with specified regulations related to aerosol transmissible diseases. Requires an employer to establish and implement effective written procedures for periodically determining the quantity and types of equipment used in its normal consumption.

TITLE: Public Health: Pandemic Protocols

SUMMARY:

Requires a health facility to limit the possible introduction of the pathogen, infection, or illness that is the subject of a declared pandemic or health related state of emergency or local emergency into the facility by indefinitely postponing routine medical appointments and prohibiting visitor access. Requires a health facility to institute universal precautions based on scientific evidence and universal source control procedures.

TITLE: Occupational Safety and Health

SUMMARY:

Requires all meetings held by The Occupational Safety and Health Standards Board to be open and public and requires that a written notice and agenda be posted on the board's internet website at least 30 calendar days before a meeting. Requires the board to post information on any proposed order or standard on its internet website no later than one calendar day following a meeting.

TITLE: Third Party Food Delivery Platforms: Food Safety

SUMMARY:

Amends the Retail Food Code. Requires ready to eat food delivered through a third party food delivery platform to be transported in a manner in which the ready to eat food is protected from contamination. Requires all bags or containers through a third party food delivery platform to be closed by the food facility with a tamper evident method prior to the food deliverer taking possession of the food.

TITLE: Environmental, Public Health, and Workers Defense Act

SUMMARY:

Amends the California Environmental, Public Health, and Workers Defense Act in relation to federal baseline standards pertaining to environmental protection. Requires specified agencies to take prescribed actions regarding certain federal

requirements and standards pertaining to air, water, and protected species. Revises the enforcement provisions of the Porter Cologne Water Quality Control Act.

TITLE: Industrial Hemp

LOCATION: Chaptered

SUMMARY:

Revises provisions regulating the cultivation and testing of industrial hemp to conform with the requirements for a state plan under the federal Agricultural Marketing Act and federal Agriculture Improvement Act. Revises the definition of industrial hemp and replacing the terms "seed breeder," "seed cultivar," and "seed development plan" with the defined terms "hemp breeder," "cultivar," and "variety development plan," respectively.

TITLE: Hazardous Substances: Regulated Metals: Packaging

LOCATION: Vetoed

SUMMARY:

Exempts, from a prohibition under the Toxics in Packaging Prevention Act, a glass package or packaging component that does not exceed a specified maximum regulated metal concentration level but for the addition of recycled material, provided that the sum of the incidental total concentration levels of all regulated metals present in the glass package or packaging component does not exceed a certain amount. Provides a repeal date for such exemption.

TITLE: Health Care Essential Workers

LOCATION: Chaptered

SUMMARY:

Requires the State Department of Public Health and the Office of Emergency Services to establish a personal protection equipment stockpile. Requires the Department to establish guidelines for the procurement, management, and distribution of PPE during a ninety day pandemic or other health emergency. Requires health care employers to maintain an inventory of new, unexpired PPE for

use in the event of a declared state of emergency. Establishes the PPE Equipment Advisory Committee.

TITLE: Immunizations: Medical Exemptions

SUMMARY:

Requires the State Department of Public Health to develop and make available for use by licensed physicians and surgeons an electronic, standardized, statewide medical exemption request that would be transmitted using the California Immunization Registry, and would be the only documentation of a medical exemption that a governing authority may accept.

TITLE: Hazardous Substances: Underground Storage Tanks

SUMMARY:

Authorizes the Water Resources Control Board to expend moneys in the Site Cleanup Subaccount for the reasonable and necessary costs incurred by the Department of Toxic Substances Control or water replenishment districts to identify the source of surface or groundwater contamination, and for the above-mentioned remediation costs.

TITLE: Williamson Act: Cultivation of Cannabis and Hemp

SUMMARY:

Authorizes rules to provide that commercial cultivation of cannabis pursuant to the Medical and Adult-use Cannabis Regulation and Safety may constitute a compatible use on contracted or noncontracted lands within an agricultural preserve.

TITLE: Cosmetic Ingredient Right to Know Act

SUMMARY:

Requires a manufacturer of a cosmetic product sold in the state to disclose to the Division of Environmental and Occupational Disease Control a list of each fragrance ingredient or flavor ingredient that is included on a designated list and a list of each fragrance allergen that is present in the cosmetic product in specified concentrations.

TITLE: Firefighting Equipment and Foam: PFAS Chemicals

LOCATION: Chaptered

SUMMARY:

Requires any person, including a manufacturer, that sells firefighter personal protective equipment to any person to provide a written notice to the purchaser at the time of sale, if the firefighter personal protective equipment contains perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances. Prohibits a manufacturer of Class B firefighting foam from manufacturing or knowingly selling, offering for sale, distributing for sale, or distributing for use, Class B firefighting foam containing intentionally added PFAS.

TITLE: Employment Safety Standards

SUMMARY:

Provides that the term employment does not include household domestic service that is publicly funded. Requires the Chief of the Division of Occupational Safety to convene an advisory committee in consultation with the Commission on Health and Safety and Workers' Compensation. Requires investigations of complaints in household domestic service employment to be conducted in a manner that avoids any unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.
